The Project

Work is evolving rapidly, with McKinsey Global Institute predicting that 1 in 16 people may need to switch jobs by 2030. Digital technologies like automation and AI are accelerating these changes, leading to more high-skill job growth while middle- and low-skill roles decline.

This EU funded VET project aims to assist young people in Kenya in finding employment by providing an environment that supports the development of both soft and hard skills through collaborative initiatives promoting VET cooperation between Africa and the European Union.

VET Trainees

The Partners have developed a comprehensive training programme to teach **VET young trainees** basic workplace skills, IT skills etc, including entrepreneurship skills e.g., how to develop a business plan, raise finance, how to market product and/or services, staffing issues, and link this to training modules on how to use and integrate new technologies e.g., basic 3D printing and Artificial intelligence into the company.

VET Trainers

The Partners have developed a comprehensive training programme to train the **VET trainers** in Kenya. The programme focuses on new pedagogics, new VET tools, steps for quality assessment, how to address difficult pedagogic cases, among others. The training programme will ensure that Kenyan VET trainers have the tools to develop their skills in the field of management, governance, innovation and particularly internationalisation.
